## 'We have a safe community' Police recorded crime statistics

#### **RECORDED** CRIME

2022-23 had the highest number of recorded crimes since 2006-07

#### **CRIME** RATE

The crime rate increased from 54 per 1,000 people in 2012-13 to 58 per 1,000 in 2022-23

#### **CRIME OUTCOME** RATE

Crime outcome rate increased from 29.4% in 2012-13 to 31.1% in 2022-23

Between 2012-13 and 2022-23 anti-social behaviour incidents declined by 28%

### 'We have a safe community' Perception of safety

**Northern Ireland Safe Community Telephone Survey 2021-22** 

reported feeling

'Very unsafe walking alone in their area after dark.'

reported feeling

'Very unsafe in their home alone at night.' **Northern Ireland Policing Board Policing Plan survey 2023** 

reported feeling

'Very unsafe in the community they live in.'

reported feeling

'Very unsafe in their local town centre.'

Factors likely to increase the feeling of fear included gender (females were more likely than males), having a disability and having been the victim of a crime in the previous two years.
