Dear ,

Thank you for your recent Freedom of Information request submitted via email to Criminal Justice Inspection Northern Ireland (CJI) on 10 October 2016 in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Our understanding of the information requested is as follows:

- copies of any and all recorded information held by CJINI about Bahrain since I January 2012;
- by recorded information you mean emails, minutes, briefing notes, reports, evaluations and diary notes; and
- full details of a meeting between Brendan McGuigan and a delegation from Bahrain's Office of the Ombudsman for the Ministry of the Interior in early 2013.

In response to your request I can confirm that the following information is being released:

- Email correspondence received by CJI on 12 December 2012 requesting and subsequently arranging a meeting a meeting between Bahrain's Police Ombudsman and Brendan McGuigan or other CJI personnel to take place on 14 January 2013 (A);
- Copy of electronic diary entry confirming the time/date of the meeting (B);
- Copy of senior management team minutes from 9 January 2013 noting a meeting with Brendan McGuigan and another CJI staff member and the Bahraini Police Ombudsman will take place on 14 January 2013 (C);

- A copy of an article published in CJI's stakeholder newsletter 'The Spec' in March 2013 with accompanying photograph about the meeting between the Bahrain's Police Ombudsman and other members of his delegation, Brendan McGuigan and other CJI personnel in January 2013 is publically available on our website http://www.cjini.org/CJNI/files/18/188c4fe8-501a-46c0-8345-da9520340f3c.pdf.

- Copy of a media enquiry received by CJI by email on 10 May 2016 and response provided on 11 May 2016 in relation to an enquiry received about Bahrain (E).

The one hour meeting on 14 January 2013 was informal, and part of an information gathering programme organised by the United Kingdom Foreign and Commonwealth Office for the Bahraini delegation. No minutes were taken by CJI of the meeting and no evaluations/reports were prepared other than the aforementioned article for The Spec newsletter.

I hope this information satisfies your request. CJI holds no further information on Bahrain.

Dear CJI,

suggested I got in touch with you about a possible meeting.

I am organising a programme for the Bahraini Police Ombudsman (Mr Nawaf Almaawdah). This is a newly created position following recommendations by an Independent Commission of Inquiry that looked in to human rights abuses that took place during the 2011 unrest. He will also be the first police ombudsman in the Gulf; we see this as a positive development and want to offer our assistance in sharing best practice.

Mr Almaawdah is on an "information gathering" visit and will also be going to the London, France and the US. He has said he is particularly interested in how departments / organisations operate at a working level i.e. how they handle complaints, how individuals are treated when in custody / prison, their role in the various processes, who they work closely with (other experts) and how they make decisions / recommendations.

We think that the Bahrainis can learn a lot from the Northern Ireland experience. Would it be possible to arrange a meeting with Mr Brendan McGuigan or someone else from the CJI? Mr Almaawdah will be in Belfast on Monday 16 and Tuesday 17 January.

We would of course provide further background and information should any meeting be arranged and our Deputy Ambassador will be accompanying Mr Almaawdah (who speaks excellent English) on his visit.

Happy to discuss further over the phone if that would be helpful.





Thanks for your enquiry. In response to your two questions it would be CJI's view that these are decisions for the Northern Ireland Prison Service and it would be inappropriate to comment further.

We would however be happy to provide the following more general comment:

"CJI's published inspections on Maghaberry Prison reported the findings of the multi-disciplinary inspection team at the time of the unannounced visit in May 2015 and the announced re-visit in January 2016. It would be our hope that work undertaken, in the seven months between the time the two inspections took place to stabilise the prison and tackle the challenges around safety identified in May 2015, would have been apparent to visitors to the facility."

Hi 💮

I'm doing an investigation into visits to Maghaberry by senior officials from the Bahrain prison service. The visits were organised by the UK Foreign Office as part of an aid project to reform Bahrain's prison service, where human rights abuses are widespread.

The CJI has raised serious concerns about conditions at Maghaberry around the time that these visitors from Bahrain attended the jail.

Please can CJI comment on:

- 1. Was this an appropriate use of the prison service's resources?
- 2. Was Maghaberry in a suitable condition for foreign officers to visit as part of a reform programme?

Background:

I am aware of at least two visits to Maghaberry by officials from Bahrain's prison service, in May 2015 (around the time inspectors visited) and around 25th January for three days (just after the

follow-up inspection).

An email from the January visit to Maghaberry's governor said:

"The feedback from our Bahraini colleague's was very positive and the group stated that your team made them feel very welcome. The itinerary for the three days was highly relevant and of interest to the group and they have certainly gained a lot of information and ideas that they can take back to their own country to put into practice."

The itinerary included "Control and Restraint training", "incident management", "substance abuse". "use of records to support investigations including management of complaints", as well as "security arrangements for separated prisoners and zoning potential for prison by areas."

Please can you get back to me by the end of tomorrow, Wednesday 11th May?
